Summer School



KEY OBJECTIVES AND TOPICS OF THE SUMMER SCHOOL

The need of a behavioural change and an active civil society in Southeast Europe (SEE) is highlighted by the region's economic and democratic challenges. This confirms that anti-corruption is not a final destination, but a consistent process of democratic renewal, checks and balances. In order to support the region's anti-corruption stakeholders and practitioners, the R2G4P initiative is organizing a 2-day summer school on **7 and 8 October 2021**. Building up on the first specialised training for R2G4P members, the summer school's three sessions are framed according to the key methodologies of the initiative.

SESSION 1

Public Procurement Integrity (7 October 2021): discusses the most common public procurement integrity issues and elaborates on the indicators that serve to assess the integrity of public institutions; provides an introduction to Opentender.eu - a free of charge platform that allows to search and analyse tender data from 33 jurisdictions, and to pinpoint red flags for potentially corrupt public procurements.

SESSION 2

State Capture Assessment Diagnostics on Economic Sector Level (7 October 2021): explains the theoretical approach towards the assessment of state capture and the methodology for identifying and assessing corruption and market monopolization risks.

SESSION 3

Monitoring anticorruption policy implementation (8 October 2021): presents the MACPI (Monitoring Anticorruption Policy Implementation) tool; provides assessment of individual public institution's anticorruption policies through quantitative surveys among employees, external experts and clients.
